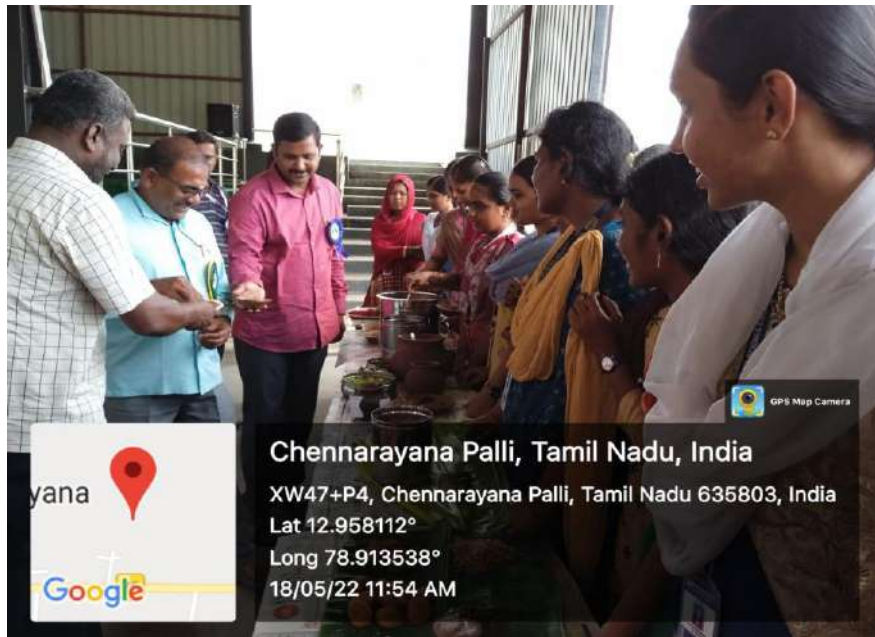
Title of the activity : “பாரம்பரிய உணவு திருவிழா”

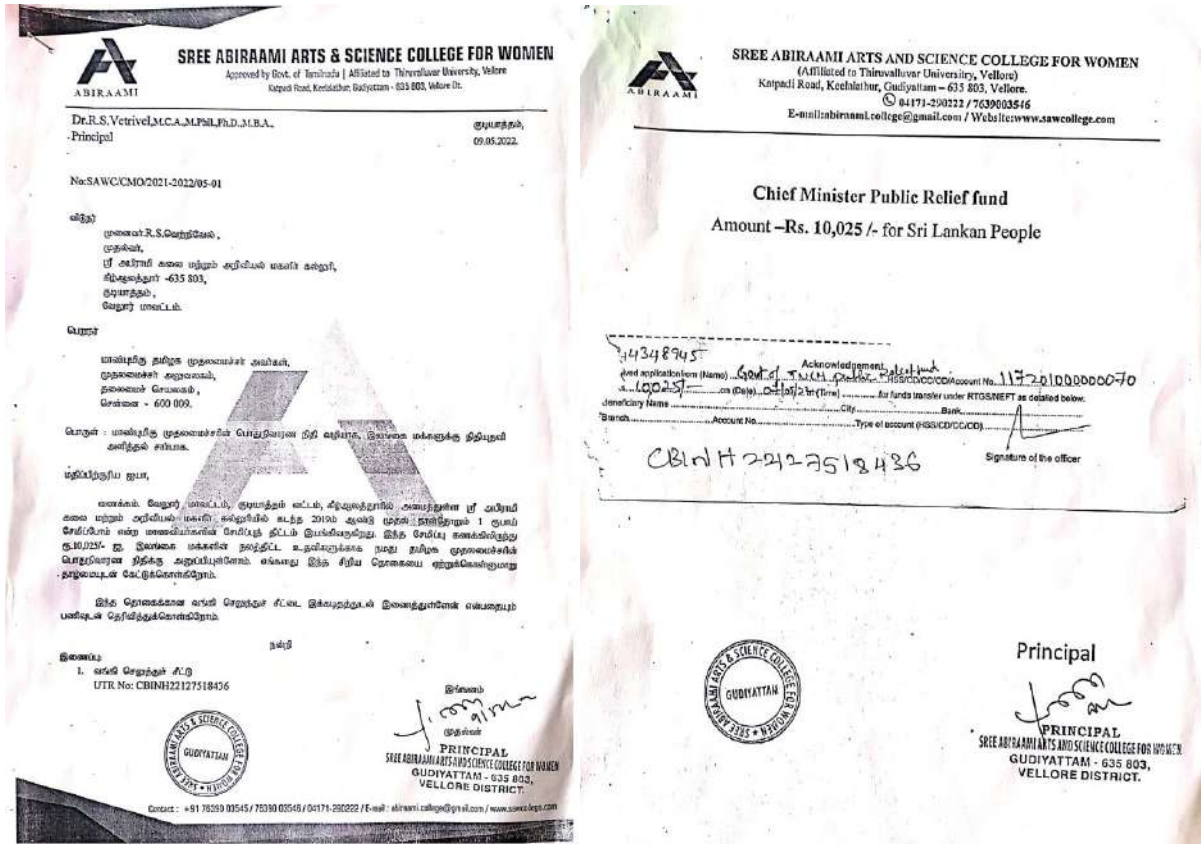


**7.1.4 Inclusive Environment Socio**

Title of the activity : Muthamizh vizha

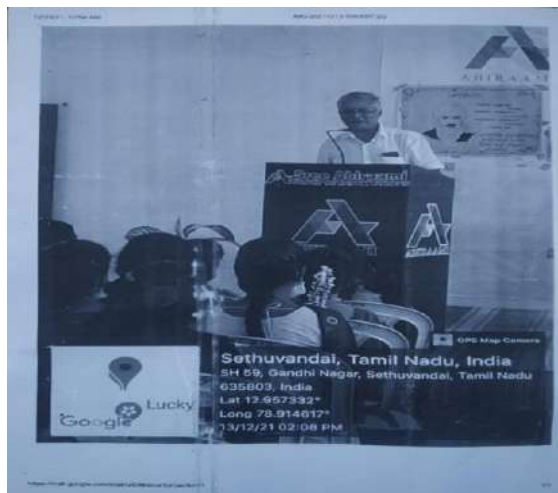

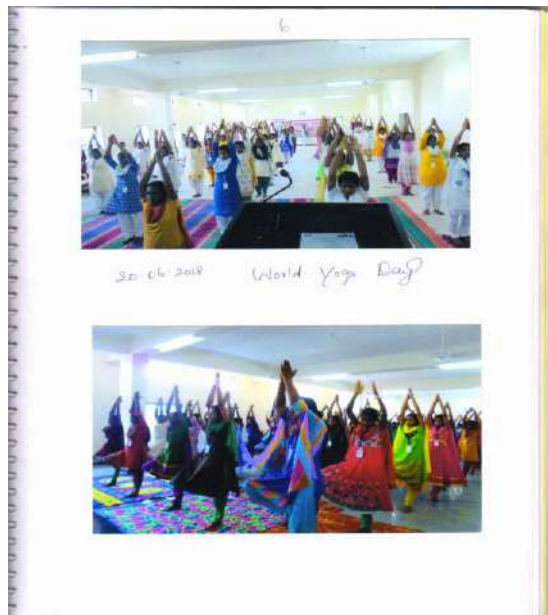
